1. The champion



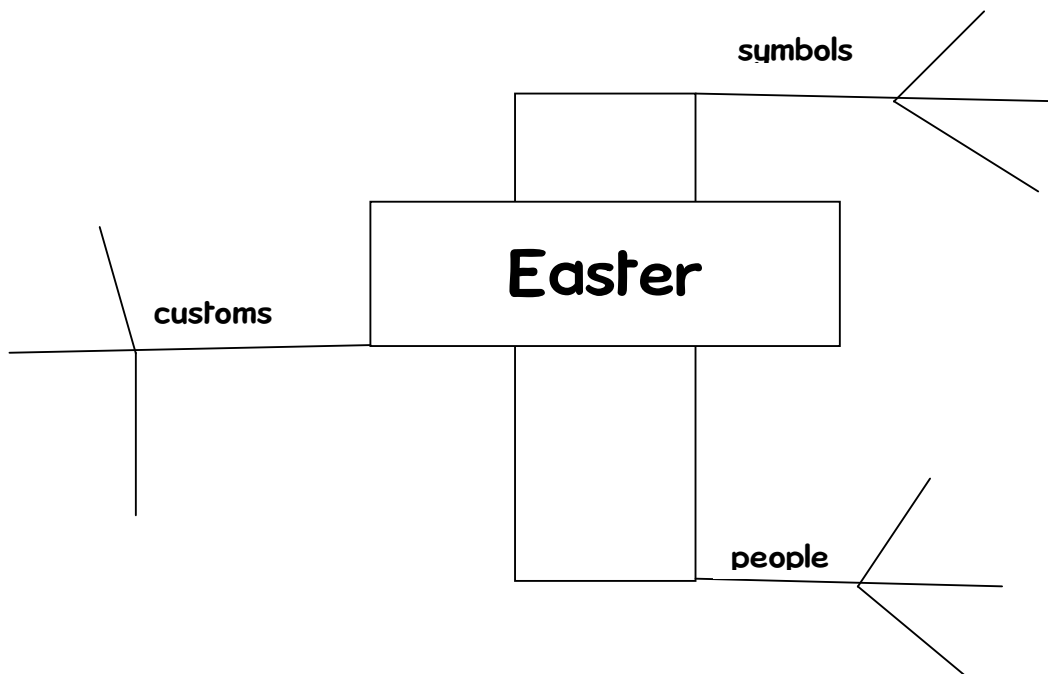
What do you think makes a champion? Think about it as you see how many little words you can make from the big word ~
