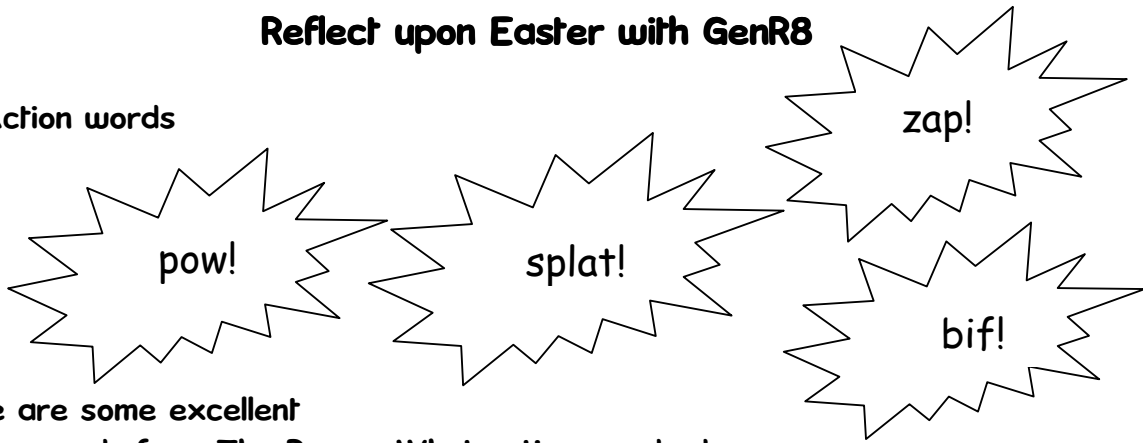

Here are some excellent action words from *The Beano*. What action words do you associate with Easter, and why?

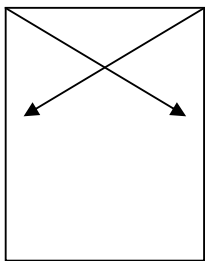
2. Happy Easter Sketch

Most of these items came into the sketch about Easter that you saw. Can you find all the following words in the word search below? Now sort out any word which was **not** in the sketch.

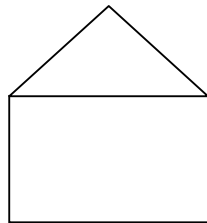

3. Folding Cross

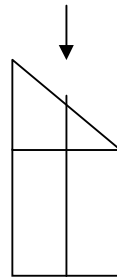


1. Start with a piece of A4 paper & fold top corners down diagonally.

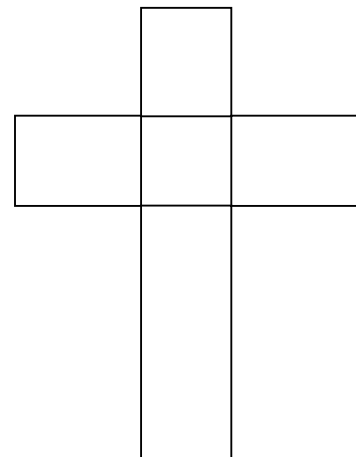


2. You have made a house shape. Now fold over vertically.

Fold & tear down here.



3. Repeat the vertical fold. Now tear down the new fold.



4. Open out the paper to reveal the cross.

4. Theme illustration ~ how far Jesus went for us

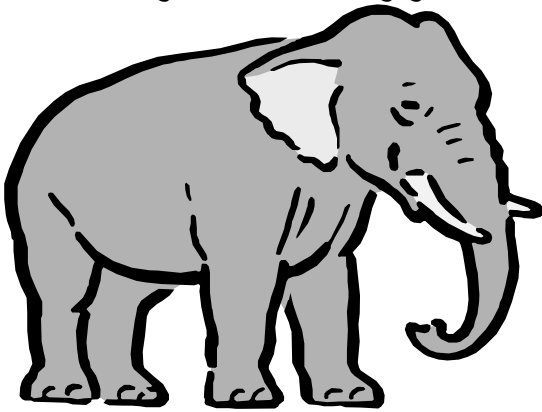
Have you ever tried to carry anyone on your back? Ask your teacher if you could carry your friend piggyback on the grass at playtime. It's really hard to go any distance, isn't it? Think about how hard it was for Jesus to carry our wrongdoing.

5. Song ~ Nobody's a nobody

Ask one of your group to lie down on some brown paper and carefully draw round them using chalk. Now inside the outline, write down words that describe a friend. How did Jesus show that he is our friend?

6. Puppets ~ A Tale about an Elephant

Start by cutting out enough 15cm squares of paper, so that everyone in the class can have one. Use paint to print your square, so that each square has one colour and texture, but each one should be different from the others. Copy an outline of Elmer on to a huge sheet of sugar paper, and add all your squares to remind you of the story you heard.



Or you could each shade part of the elephant using pencil shading, and copying the style from 'Where the wild Things Are'.

7. Bible Sketch

Use this story to perform a mime, whilst a narrator re-tells the tale.

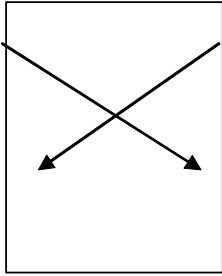
8. Song ~ For God so loved the World

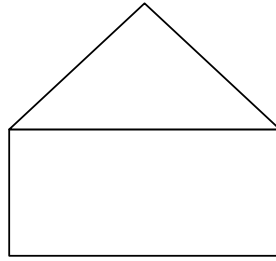
How to tear a Cross (for Unit 11)

1. Start with a piece of A4 paper book



'This is to explain what baptism means.'

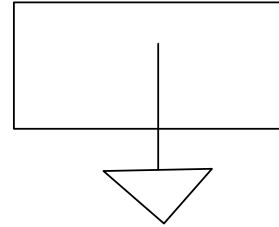
2. Fold each top corner down to meet the side.



'The child belongs to the church and home families.'

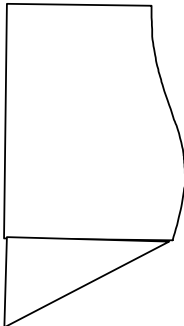
3. Fold the triangle back to make a

'We can read about Jesus in the Bible at church or at home.'

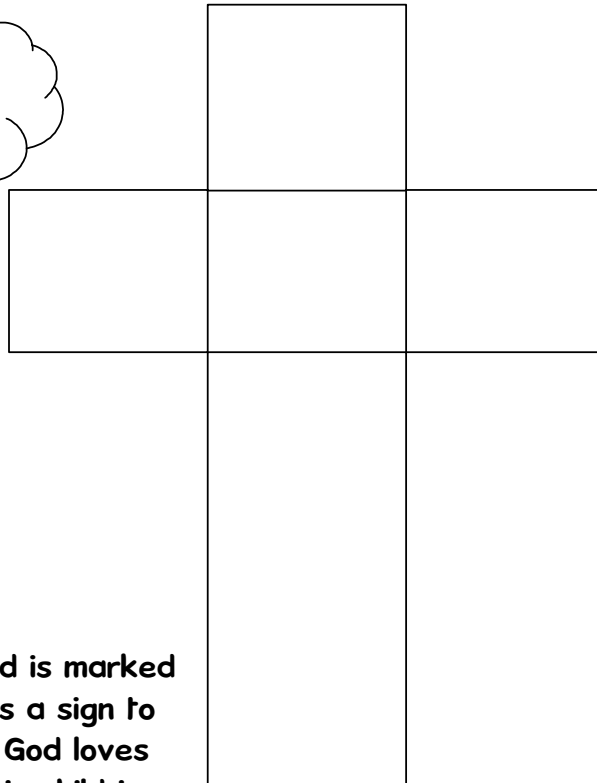
4. Fold the book in half and tear down in line with the edges of the triangle. carefully
